



Dear Parents/Carers,

I am pleased to inform you after receiving lots of interest in support of a school trip we have secured a visit to the Little Owl Farm park on **Wednesday 9th July 2025**. The visit to the farm will be an excellent experience which will support your child's learning of the theme 'Our Wonderful World'.

On the date of the trip we ask that your child attends school in their P.E kit with a hoodie, cardigan or a jumper. This will ensure that they are comfortably dressed for the farm and easy to identify around the setting. Please be mindful of the everchanging weather. If it is expected to be hot please ensure that you apply sun cream to your child before they attend school, as well as sending in a named hat. If rain is expected please do ensure that your child brings in a light raincoat. I will of course send out a reminder nearer to the time of the forecast.

The children will be away from school for the day and they will be eating their lunch at the venue. Therefore, they will require a packed lunch. Please ensure that you send your child to school with a packed lunch from home or notify school if you would prefer to order a packed lunch from the school caterers (this option is available for all Reception aged pupils). If you choose to order a packed this will need to be ordered by **Wednesday 2nd July 2025**.

As previously informed during March in order for the trip to take place we ask for a voluntary donation of **£18.31** per child. If your child is entitled to Pupil Premium funding then you will be asked to donate fifty percent of the total cost and the school will fund the additional fifty percent. Therefore, the cost will be **£9.15**. The cost includes the entry to the farm park, a guided tour, a VIP animal encounter with food to feed the animals, an ice lolly each and transport costs. All costs need to be paid via **Parent Pay** by **Friday 5th July 2025**.

I believe that the visit to the farm park will be wonderful opportunity for the children to explore what a farm has to offer and learn about taking care of animals.
