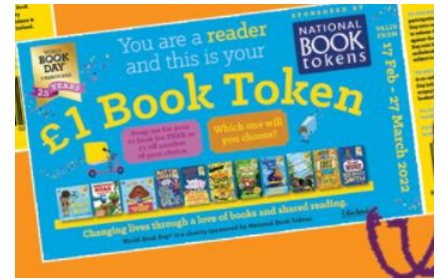


Here are some examples to inspire you with some ideas:
