How can we keep our school happy and safe?

- Play with children who may be on their own or upset, check they are ok
- Use Heartsmart ideas to help you through if you have a problem
- Speak to a trusted adult at school to help you
- Playleaders and well-being champions can help us if we need them

What can help at school if you are being bullied, feel upset or unsafe?

- Walk away
- Ignore them
- Tell the teacher
- Tell your friends
- Speak out loud, don't be afraid
